

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR MIGRANTS COMING FROM GREECE OR OTHER COUNTRIES TO ITALY BY ADRIATIC SEA

If you arrived by ferry or cruise ship from a seaport, you are now in one of the following Italian cities: Brindisi, Bari, Ancona, Ravenna, Venezia or Trieste.



YOUR FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS IN ITALY

→ YOU CANNOT BE RETURNED TO A COUNTRY WHERE YOU MIGHT BE VICTIM OF PERSECUTION OR SERIOUS HARM :

In Italy you can ask for international protection (“protezione internazionale”) also called political asylum (“asilo politico”). The request for international protection can be made by anyone, at any time.

You can make a request for international protection if you:

- you were a victim or if you fear that you will become a victim of violence, persecution, discrimination, threats and, in general, violations of your fundamental rights in your country of origin for reasons related to ethnicity, religion, nationality, membership of a social group, or because of your political opinions;
- if your country is involved in an international armed conflict or internal armed conflict
- if there are risks of being killed or tortured or other degrading treatments back to your country of origin.

→ TO STAY IN ITALY AND NOT TO BE PUSHED BACK OR EXPELLED IF YOU ARE AN UNACCOMPANIED MINOR (under 18 years old):

- to stay in a places specifically dedicated to minors
- to have a “legal guardian” (“tutore”)

→ NOT TO BE EXPELLED IF YOU ARE IN A VULNERABLE CONDITION:

Foreigners under the age of eighteen, except for the right to follow the expelled parent, people in possession of a residence permit, people with relatives within the second degree or with their spouse of Italian nationality; women who are pregnant or in the six months following the birth of their child; people in a particularly serious health condition.

IMPORTANT ADVICES

→ **In case you are stopped inside the ferry/cruise ship you can ask verbally for asylum (international protection) to the captain and/or to the local authorities in the seaport (in order to ask for asylum you will be conducted to the police office).** If this is your will, you have the right to ask for asylum (orally or in writing - in a language you know);

→ **For the asylum request you can** meet local organisations/associations/protection bodies;

→ You have the right to have legal information, translations, a copy of the documents;

→ you have the right to have a written copy of all important documents you receive, to understand what is written in these documents and to refuse to sign documents that you can't understand;

→ **In case of physical and/or verbal violences by police officers and/or other actors/people** (you are beaten, deprived of water, food, basic necessities, if you have are insulted, threatened): you have the right to have your personal liberty and not to suffer any kind of violence, including in case of **detention/arrest/forced transfer** to a police station and/or other places, in case of detention inside and/or outside the vessel or in case of any form of pressure (physical or psychological) have been exerted over you;

→ Remember to declare any vulnerability such as disabilities, elderly condition, members of single-parent families with minor children and minors, victim of serious psychological, physical or sexual violence.
